

500 MOTOR RACING CLUB OF IRELAND LTD.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. The 500 Motor Racing Club of Ireland will organise a National A/National B Sprint on 5th July 2009 at Kirkistown Race Circuit.
2. The meeting will be Held Under the General Regulations of the RAC Motor Sports Association Ltd. [incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA] these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the club may issue for the event.
3. RACMSA. Permit numbers: **TBA** have been issued for the meeting.
4. The events are open to all holders of current MSA and MI Competition Licences appropriate for the event.
5. All Competitors must produce a valid competition licence and club membership card.
6. The event is a a round of the SBD British Sprint Championship. Permit No: **CHS 2009/006**
7. The programme of the meeting will be:-
 - 7.1. Scrutineering will start at 10.00 hours in Paddock.
 - 7.2. Any competitor not signed on by 11.30 hours may be excluded.
 - 7.3. Practice runs start at 12.00 hours.
 - 7.4. Timed runs to start not earlier than 14.00 hours.
8. The length of the course is 4400m over 1.85 laps and consists of 15 corners including 1 Chicane.
9. The event will consist of 14 classes as detailed on pages 59-61 of the ANICC 2009 Yearbook.
 - Class 1. Modified Saloons and Sports Cars up to 1400cc, having no more than two valves per cylinder.
 - Class 2. Modified Saloons and Sports Cars over 1401cc and up to 2300cc having no more than two valves per cylinder.
 - Class 3. Modified Saloons and Sports Cars over 2301cc, and multi-valve vehicles.
 - Class 4. Rally Cars having no more than two driven wheels up to 1700cc
 - Class 5. Rally Cars having no more than two driven wheels over 1700cc
 - Class 6. Road going Saloons and Sports Cars up to 1700cc.
 - Class 7. Road going Saloons and Sports Cars over 1700cc.
 - Class 8. Modified Road and Kit Cars up to 2500cc having no more than two valves per cylinder
 - Class 9. All other Modified Road and Kit cars
 - Class 10. Historic road going saloons and sports cars.
 - Class 11. Cars complying with Formula Vee and MSA FF1600 regulations and Crossle Classic Cup (as defined by Crossle Car Co) regulations.
 - Class 12. Formula Libre i.e. Single Seater, Sports/Racing (inc. Clubmans) Chassis Cars, up to 1400cc multi valve and up to 2000cc with no more than two valves per cylinder.
 - Class 13. All other Formula Libre
 - Class 14. All other 4WD modified cars

Notes:

GENERAL

- i Forced induction will be considered as subject to a 1.4:1 engine capacity coefficient
- ii All cars entered in Classes 1,2,3,4 and 5 must have no more than two driven wheels
- iii Cars in Classes 1-7 & 10 must have an operable reverse gear
- iv The Organising Club and Championship Organisers reserve the right to reclassify vehicles according to eligibility
- v The Championship Organisers reserve the right to have any vehicle examined with regard to class eligibility and engine capacity

All vehicles entered in Classes 1-3 must be based on either a series production engine or chassis:

- a In all vehicles the engine must remain in the original chassis location. i.e. front, mid or rear
- b A vehicle based on a series production engine must have the 'silhouette' of the 'donor' vehicle
- c A vehicle based on a series production chassis may use any power unit, but must retain the original method of chassis construction

Cars entered in Classes 4 & 5 must be capable of passing scrutineering for a National B status Stage Rally (Section H, 2009 MSA Competitors Yearbook). A current Road Fund Licence or Vehicle Test Certificate is not required. Registration documents must be available at scrutineering if requested.

10. Starting Order - Competitors will be started singly in an order determined by the Organisers.
 - 10.1. The starting signal will be by light signal. (see I. 10,11)
 - 10.2. The Method of timing will be electronic - Activated by light beam.
 - 10.3. No car will be allowed to start without a Timing Strut (see I. 24; I. 67)
 - 10.4. The Finish will be indicated by a line and waved flag.
 - 10.5. After crossing the finishing line, competitors must slow down as appropriate and proceed as instructed.
11. Competitors may walk the course before having the opportunity of two practice runs. (Also see I .7)
12. Numbers will not be supplied by the organisers, but must comply with I. 30

13. No time will be credited for any competitor with all 4 wheels off circuit. (Also see 1.43,44)
 13.1. All Marshals and Officials will be nominated Judges of Fact. They will adjudicate on the following :-
 Unsatisfactory and/or false start - not following correct course - touching marker - baulking.

14. **AWARDS**

- 14.1. Award for the fastest time of day (The winner will not be eligible for a class Award)
 14.2. Award for fastest time by a Lady competitor
 14.3. Award for 1st in Class (if 3 or more Competitors)
 14.4. Award for 2nd in Class (if 5 or more competitors)
 14.5. Award for 3rd in class (if 7 or more competitors)
 14.6. Additional awards may be presented at organisers discretion.
 14.7. Awards will be presented in the Clubhouse 30 minutes after provisional results have been posted on notice board.
15. The Maximum entry for the meetings is 100. The minimum entry 40. The minimum for each class is 3. Classes with 3 competitors or fewer may be amalgamated with other classes as necessary.

16. **The entry list opens on receipt of these regulations and closes 14 days before the event.**

17. **The entry fee is £85.00 for each event (or, for both, £150.00) and must be accompanied by an official entry form (completed in full). Please complete a separate entry form for each event. NO LATE OR UNPAID ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.**

18. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. An entry cancelled after the closing date will be refunded (if the organisers are advised in writing) less £10.00 administration fee up to 3 days before the event. If less than 3 days prior to the event entry fees will not be refunded.
